## CAMPING IN LOFOTEN







## Welcome to Lofoten!

Have you heard about the Norwegian right to roam that allows you to camp on romantic beaches, remote mountains and in the deep forests?

Please read the backside of this flyer before you throw on your backpack and hurry into the Lofoten wilderness.

## Basic rules of camping

- Only camp on "uncultivated land"
- Keep at least a 150 metres' distance to the nearest inhabited house or cabin. This also applies for caravans and campervans.
- You are welcome to camp 2 nights in the same place without the landowner's permission.
- Please note that in Lofoten we do have areas with restrictions on camping. See our outdoor map to localize these areas:



 Be considerate and thoughtful. Don't damage nature and other surroundings.
Leave the landscape as you would want to find it.

## Limits in the right to roam

- The right to roam applies only to "uncultivated land" which covers most shores, bogs, forests and mountains. Small parts of uncultivated land located inside cultivated areas are not regarded as open country.
- The right to roam does not apply to "cultivated land" such as plowed fields with or without crops, meadows, pastures and gardens, graveyards, football fields, building plots and industrial areas.
